FOREWORD

The 11th Novembertagung on the history of mathematics took place from November 2nd to November 5th, 2000 in Brno (the Czech Republic). The 11th Novembertagung was supported by the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science of the Brno University of Technology, which provided the conference room.

The meeting in Brno was attended by a representative from the Netherlands, Austria, and Poland, as well as by two representatives from France and four from Germany (one of those from Mexico). Czech Ph.D. students in history of mathematics constituted a major part of the 22 participants. The general topic for the 11th Novembertagung, *Mathematics and Culture*, was introduced by Emil Siemonov from the University of Technology in Vienna. On Saturday, the participants could hear a special talk on DIRK JAN STRUIK (1894–2000), given by Gerard Alberts.

An essential part of every Novembertagung is also the time between the talks and after the talks, in the evenings. Despite rainy weather, the participants took a walk through Brno, the birthplace of KURT GÖDEL.
